 - prepares students at the school for the opportunities, responsibilities and experiences of adult lif

Curriculum Intent

Birchwood's Key Stage 3 curriculum intention is to provide and develop foundation knowledge and skills based on the National Curriculum. From Year 7 to 9 students study continuously: English, Literacy, Mathematics, Science, one or two Modern Foreign Languages, Physical Education, and PSHCE (Personal, Social, Health and Citizenship Education). Furthermore, we have planned and sequenced our curriculum so that the National Curriculum aims and content of Geography, History, Computing, Art, Music and Design Technology have been met in full by the end of Year 8.

- English have 4 hrs a week in recognition of building literacy skills in the initial stages of secondary school
- Maths and Science have a core entitlement of 3 hours each
- Physical Education have 2.5 hrs and Expressive & Performing Arts (Art, Music, and Drama) have 3 hours, stressing the importance of creative and physical aspects to the curriculum.
- Modern Foreign Languages are allocated 3 hrs per week, again reflecting the need to build foundational skills in this area. All students follow French in Year 7, with the option of adding Spanish or German during the year.
- Technology have 2.5 hours a week with an additional 0.5 hours a week to ensure Food Technology is taught to all students
- Humanities have 3 hours and study History, Geography and RS equally
- All students receive statutory PSHCE teaching in their form groups

Year 9

In Year 9 individual National Curriculum subject pathways are available that ensure Students get a broad and balanced curriculum with an Ebacc suite and a Creative Suite of courses that students have the ability to opt into, ensuring they balance both suites.

- All curriculum content will be taught from developed Key 3 content and skills and will form a Foundation Core Curriculum
- English remains at 4 hours to ensure curriculum coverage and support with high levels of literacy across the curriculum
- Maths and Science continue with a core entitlement of 3 hours each
- Physical Education have 2 hours
- Expressive & Performing Arts (Art, Music, Drama, and Dance) and Technology (D&T, Food) will be placed in a Creative Suite from which a minimum 2 options are to be taken, ensuring the importance of creative and physical aspects to the curriculum are retained.
- Modern Foreign Languages (French, German, Spanish) and Humanities (History, Geography, RS) as well as Computer Science are all in an EBACC Suite from which a minimum 2 options are to be taken, ensuring a broad and balanced curriculum
- All students receive statutory PSHCE teaching in their form groups
- There is a small degree of flexibility for those wanting to continue with two languages and also for this who need an adapted curriculum.

Year 10 and 11

Birchwood's Key Stage 4 curriculum is for Year 10 and 11. Core and optional subjects are studied, which are mostly based around the curriculum of GCSE specifications and which also include vocational options. In order for students to achieve their dreams and so we can support their future, we encourage pupils to take the Ebacc subjects, however, we recognise that for some this is not appropriate.

- All curriculum content will be taught at Level 2 (GCSE, BTEC, OCR)
- English and Maths both have 4 hours
- Science increases to 4.5 to cover the Trilogy and Triple content
- Physical Education have 2 hours
- Modern Foreign Languages (French, German, Spanish) and Humanities (History, Geography) as well as Computer Science are all in an EBACC Suite from which a minimum 1 option is to be taken
- All other subjects are placed in the Open Choice and 3 choices can be made.
- All students receive statutory PSHCE teaching in their form groups
- There is a degree of flexibility for those who need an adapted curriculum.

Year 12 and 13

Our Key Stage 5 programmes of study lasts for two years, from Year 12 to 13. In that time our students choose from a range of A Level and Btec courses. English and Maths retake at Level 2, EPQ and enrichment opportunities are also available.

Our Key Stage 5 curriculum aims to balance academic excellence, personal support, and a wide range of student leadership opportunities. We provide a diverse curriculum of 32 subjects. We attempt to make the curriculum flexible and respond to student led demand, therefore ensuring that we can meet the diverse and varied range of needs incumbent of a comprehensive school.

The majority of our Year 11 students apply for places in our Sixth Form to follow a predominantly A level curriculum, although an increasing range of BTEC vocational opportunities also exist. The curriculum is designed to support students as they step into Higher Education, University, Higher Level Apprenticeships, or more aspirational employment.

Our Key Stage 5 curriculum therefore provides students with a strong platform from which to achieve excellent academic results, but also allows them to develop into well-rounded and tolerant young adults with plenty of enrichment and leadership opportunities.

Entrance Requirements

All applicants, both internal and external, will need to complete an online application form via ULAS.

We operate a Total Point Score (TPS) system that measures what students achieve at GCSE / Level 2. This works by taking the best 8 subject grades. These are then added together to produce a Total Point Score, as shown in the worked example further down.

Students Total Point Score will determine which curriculum plans are most suitable for them. Our curriculum plans are designed to ensure students are following appropriate courses based upon their prior levels of attainment.

We will offer all students information, advice, and guidance in reference to their application to ensure students are making appropriate choices. Students must meet the entrance criteria for courses they wish to study.

At KS5 we will offer only level 3 courses for study. The only exceptions to this is GCSE English and GCSE Maths resits, which will be compulsory for any students we admit without a grade 4 in these subjects. For this reason, there will be an admission benchmark of TPS 34. Students will also need to meet the individual entrance requirements for specific subjects and courses.

Total Point Score

TPS (Total Points Score) is calculated by adding together a student's total GCSE / BTEC grades at Level 2.

Pathway 1: to study 4 A Level 3 courses students should have a TPS of above 48 and meet the entry requirements of the subject.

We will consider entry onto Pathway 1 dependent on subject requirements.

Students will be expected to supplement their 4 subjects with additional supporting qualifications and/or enrichment opportunities.

Pathway 2: to study 3 Level 3 courses students should have a TPS of above 40 and meet the entry requirements of the subject.

We will consider entry onto Pathway 2 dependent on subject requirements.

Students will be expected to supplement their 4 subjects with additional supporting qualifications and/or enrichment opportunities.

Pathway 3: to study 2 Level 3 courses and a Level 2, students should have a TPS of above 34 and meet the entry requirements of the subject. We will consider entry onto Pathway 3 dependent on subject requirements.

Students will be expected to supplement their 4 subjects with additional supporting qualifications and/or enrichment opportunities.
