On the evening of the 6 July, three students from our Year 12 Spanish class attended the wonderful 'Alma by Ballet Flamenco Sara Baras' Flamenco show at the Sadler's Wells Theatre in London. We met Miss Roderick, Miss Defay and Mrs van Baalen at 16:00 at the train station ready to head into London by train and underground. On arrival we all headed to a traditional Spanish 'tapas' (small savoury dishes) restaurant called "Llerena", where we enjoyed the most delicious meals ranging from pan con tomate (bread with tomato), anchovies, toasted peppers, patatas bravas, chorizo, and so much more. After a very filling dinner, we made our way to the theatre in time for the 19:30 start.

The show was spectacular, beautiful, glamorous and packed with brilliant choreography and highly skilled dancers who filled us with emotions without uttering a word. Accompanied by the incredible singers and band, Sara Baras and her dancers managed to create a stunning atmosphere full of emotion that took your breath away each time they stepped on the stage. It was superb cultural immersion which has massively improved our understanding of Flamenco and its origins in the Spanish culture. What a show!

Geography Students visit the River Rib

On Friday 29 September, 8Y (X side went on Thursday) went on a geography trip to the River Rib. We took the coach to Standon and then walked to where we were going to carry out our investigations. The investigations we carried out included: a valley profile, a sketch of the area, a biodiversity investigation and a water speed and velocity investigation. For water speed and velocity investigation we went in the water to measure the depth all the way along the width of the river. We took note of all our findings. The velocity test was carried out by putting a tennis ball in the water and timing how long it took to travel 12m. To complete the sketch of the area we went to the top of the valley and drew the main parts of the river and its surroundings, for example the meander. We also looked at the different plant species living around the river. We found that grass was the dominant species. For the valley profile, we put two poles 5m apart and looked through a clinometer to see what angle was between the two poles. This formed the valley profile. I thoroughly enjoyed the trip to the River Rib, it was so much better than normal school.

Our Alumni student Callum Jolly shares his pathway from School...

Callum took a big leap into tech at Tesco four and a half years ago, and he's never looked back. And with a project like Whoosh, there's even more innovation ahead. Take it away, Callum.

"I joined Tesco on a commercial apprenticeship straight out of school and started as a Buyer's Assistant, selecting the products we stock in store. I ended up mostly working on buying in dolls for children, which seems funny now and so removed from my role in tech.

I've moved roles a few times since then, but it was working in the Online team that got me interested in technology. I was working on developments for the Tesco website, looking at how our products were advertised online. My role was to write the business cases for any changes, and then the Product team on the tech side would take over. They'd speak with Design, Analytics, Optimisation, and Research, to make sure that the work proposed was right for our customers. Then they'd implement the changes, build it, get results, run tests.

I'd watch all this happening from afar and feel like I was missing out on some really interesting, exciting stuff. So I started to take steps towards moving into the Product team. It's now been four and a half years since I moved over, and I'm still absolutely loving it.



Over the summer Mr Morton, whose mother suffers from a rare variant of Dementia was delighted to find out a raffle he had helped to promote and organise had been a huge success. Alzheimer's Research UK's Rachel Bates said "Mr Morton has shared his story to support the Alzheimer's Research UK Spring Raffle and has helped to raise an incredible £76,983 for dementia research!'

Mr Morton's family have been actively engaged in Dementia Research for over a decade. His mother has worked with Researchers from Cambridge University and the University of London and has had multiple brain scans, also taking part in longitudinal testing whilst Mr Morton has worked with several researchers looking at the impact of dementia on carers and on patients in the later stages of the disease.
