We will update you on plans in the new year.

Most importantly Birchwood is a happy place where students are keen to study and where staff enjoy working. As such it has been a real pleasure getting to know the school over the last few months and I am excited about the potential it has for the coming years.

The Christmas holiday never quite seems like a break as we all get involved in events with families and friends. I hope that whatever you are up to you have some time to pause and relax. I wish you all a very Merry Christmas and look forward to working with you all in 2024.

Polecon politics conference

Year 12 and 13 Politics students recently attended the Polecon conference in Westminster, London, providing them with the ability to see in person some of the figures in their textbooks and hear what they have to say. Many key figures were in attendance, and they each discussed what they thought was relevant to their current agenda.

Jeremy Corbyn, current MP for Islington North and former leader of the opposition for Labour from 2015-2020 discussed the current issues with inequality within the UK and his personal view on economics and on how tax distribution should be put in place. Corbyn put forward a case for higher taxation for the top bracket of earners to close the disastrous income inequality, with many thriving with too much while some live in absolute poverty. Corbyn further suggested an increase in the personal allowance to aid the poorest in England as they are whom the funds should be directed at.

Corbyn was challenged twice regarding previous attacks on him in the media and responded well to the comments: "Anti-Semitism is evil, homophobia is evil, Islamophobia is evil, and all other forms of racism are evil. There must be a zero-tolerance approach to every form of racism as no hierarchy of such should exist in this country."

Whilst controversial Conservative political figure Jacob Rees-Mogg, former leader of the House of Commons, touched on a number of topics with a very different viewpoint, ranging from the current Rwanda debate and the Conservative Party's approach to the Supreme Court ruling of the unlawful nature of the policy and his recognition of the current awful trend of the opinion polls not looking in the Conservative Party's best interests. He threw subtle shade at current Prime Minister Rishi Sunak by stating that "politics has become presidential; the electorate base their view on the leader not the party." Sir Ed Davey, current leader of the Liberal Democratic Party spoke about his plan moving forward, by acknowledging the unlikelihood of his party gaining office and that they will therefore strategise by targeting what is known as 'Blue wall seats', seats which are traditionally won by the Conservative Party. Current debate shows that increasingly more of the youth are leaning closer and closer towards the political Centre, losing hope with the current Labour Party and therefore may choose to vote Lib Dem at the next general election.

We also got to hear from leader of the Scottish National Party in Westminster, Stephen Flynn who, unsurprisingly, spoke extensively about the prospects for another Scottish independence referendum, praising Corbyn for wanting free tuition fees for the youth in the UK to match the free tuition fees obtained in Scotland through a 2008 bill. He spoke about Scotland's right to self-govern the same way that England chose to make its own respective laws by exiting the EU in 2020.

Overall, the experience was fantastic. The last Polecon conference was cancelled because of the 2019 election and the build-up of excitement for this one has been great. Learning from a textbook is one experience, but hearing what our ministers have to say in person, without a script face to face is a whole new world. It was so educational and certainly provided me with better insight for when exams come around and students are required to include evidence to back up the points they make in their essays.

The Edge Environmental group

The Edge Environmental group recently held their half termly meeting in the library with the focus placed on how the team could improve energy usage across the school.

The session was led by James Veness from the Energy Sparks organisation who provided an overview of what the Energy Sparks portal could provide to the school. He outlined a number of key actions the school could undertake to investigate the reduction in the "baseload" of the school. Students were encouraged to look at the costs of running items like kettles, fridges, water coolers and PCs. The school has purchased a number of energy monitors and students will start looking at key items in the coming weeks. With the Christmas break fast approaching students were also asked to encourage all staff to switch off as many appliances as possible over the Christmas shutdown.

The second part of the meeting was taken up with James Veness touring the school with pupils and looking at the heat loss across many of our school buildings with the use of a Thermal Imaging camera . There were many interesting conclusions from this and ranged from doors being left wide open whilst trying to heat the areas through to the significant heat loss through poor window insulation from the MFL area in B Block

The school is currently looking at a CIF capital bid for replacement windows for this block and the thermal imaging pictures taken by the students will be included in the bid to be submitted later this month.

It makes South Africa's 4th world title, currently the highest out of any team. To make it more impressive, South Africa have only participated in four RWC tournaments, meaning they've won it every time they entered.

Technology Project - the making of a Tie-dye cushion

During the first half term of the new school year, in technology we were asked to design pillows. We started the process to make our pillows by tie-dyeing the cotton material. I used the colours pink, purple and blue. It was hard to tie-dye as



we had to tie the elastic bands really tight, so when we untied the materials, the colours would actually show. Unfortunately, my class had to re-do the tie-dyeing because we forgot to iron the materials. We had to iron the materials because if we didn't the dye wouldn't show up and would fade.

Our next step was to block print, which I found rather difficult because it was not easy printing the block onto the material. We all had a wooden block and had to paint over it with a simple design; my pattern consisted of blue, green and orange circles and I used these colours since they matched with my tie-dye. There were lots of different block printing methods to choose from: block repeat, brick-half repeat, half-drop repeat and random repeat. I decided to use block repeat as I thought it would go well with the rest of my design. After that we created little objects to sew onto our block print materials.

Finally, we got onto sewing our final piece together! This meant we sew the tie-dye material onto the block print material to make our pillow. Most of the class sewed by using the sewing machine, but I hand-sewed instead, as I thought it would be easier. We had to tack around the materials, so it would stay in place, whilst we cautiously stitched around the whole cushion. We did not zip the back because I think it would've been too complicated. The final result was a great success and now I have a lovely cushion to use at home.
